PowerPack for Vault 2025.2



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1. GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT VERSION 2025.2

The 2025.2 version of the **PowerPack for Vault** comes with improvements on the existing features:

- Possibility to define email templates in Powerpack for Vault E-mailing tool.
- Enhanced communication due to new option to add CC recipients in the Powerpack for Vault E-mailing tool.

The users of Autodesk Vault versions 2024 and 2025 will benefit from these novelties from the **PowerPack for Vault 2025.2**, as this version can be installed on both versions of the platform.

1.1. COMPLIANCY WITH AUTODESK VAULT 2025

The **PowerPack for Vault 2025.2** is compliant with **Autodesk Vault Client 2024 and 2025 versions**.

The PowerPack for Vault 2025.2 can be installed using the Setup PowerPack for Vault 2025.2. The setup will install version 2025.2 of the PowerPack on Vault 2024 and 2025, if these were previously installed.



2. IMPROVEMENTS

In this version, based on user feedback, we improved the Email/Property tool by adding CC recipient functionality and the ability to configure email templates.

2.1. EMAIL TEMPLATES

We have enabled email header, body, and footer customization, along with the option to save these configurations as templates configurable by the Vault administrator and accessible to Vault Client users.

This improvement comes with a modification of the user interface to accommodate the new options.

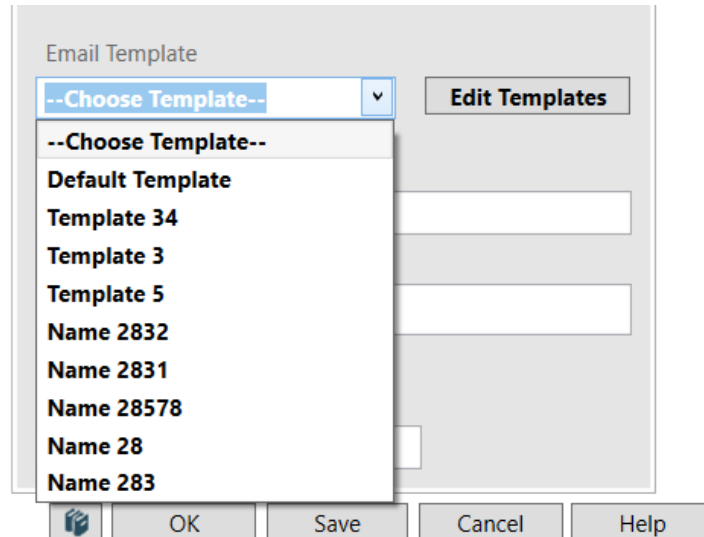
In the **Email configuration dialog**, the Email tab has been modified, and **Email Template** option has been added:

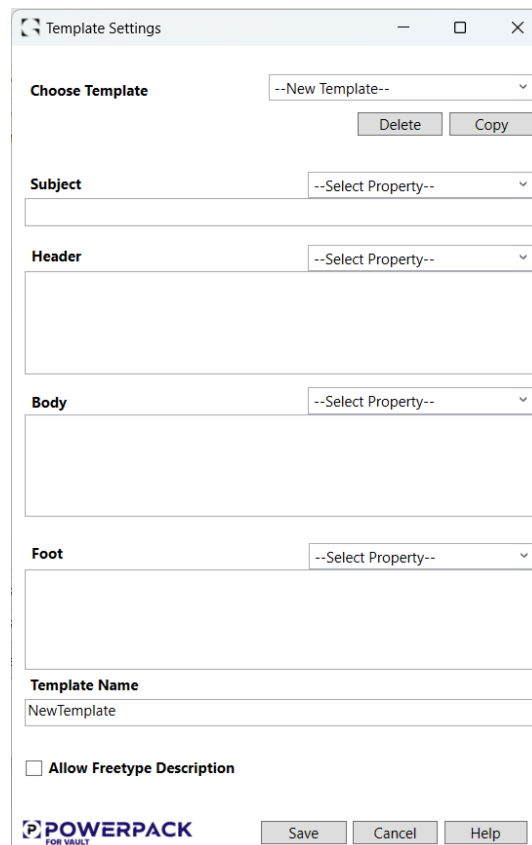
Email Template option

In the Email tab, the user will select a predefined template from the drop-down menu.



Email Template drop-down menu

The drop-down menu list is populated based on the templates created using the option **Edit Templates**. The Edit Templates option is allowing the admin to define templates in the **Template Settings** dialog, for the emails which are sent automatically to the recipients.



Template Settings

In the Template Settings dialog, users can define the Subject, Header, Body, and Footer, as shown in the example of an email with an applied template.

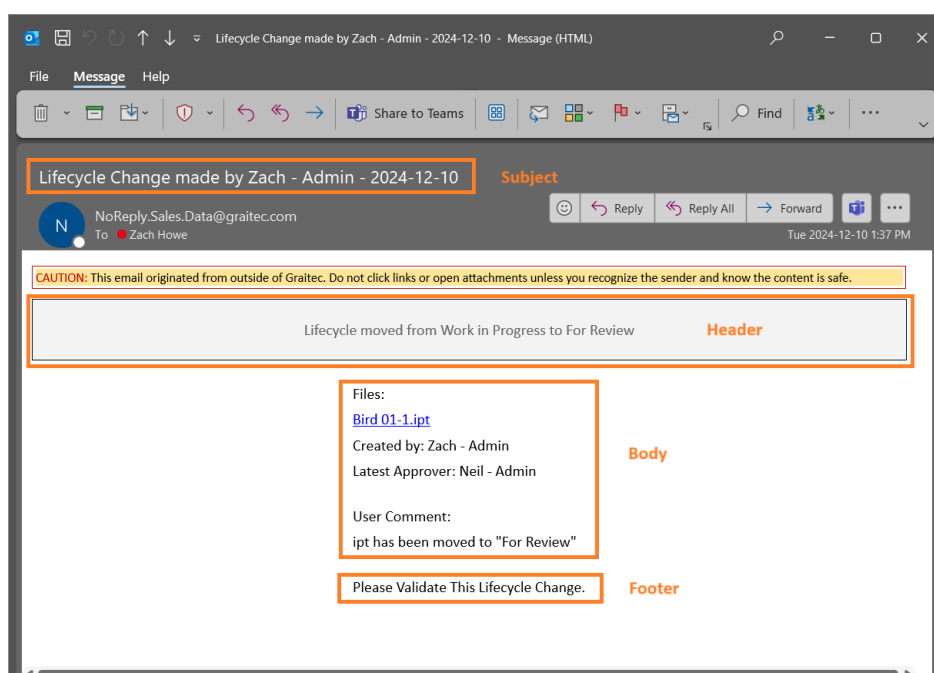

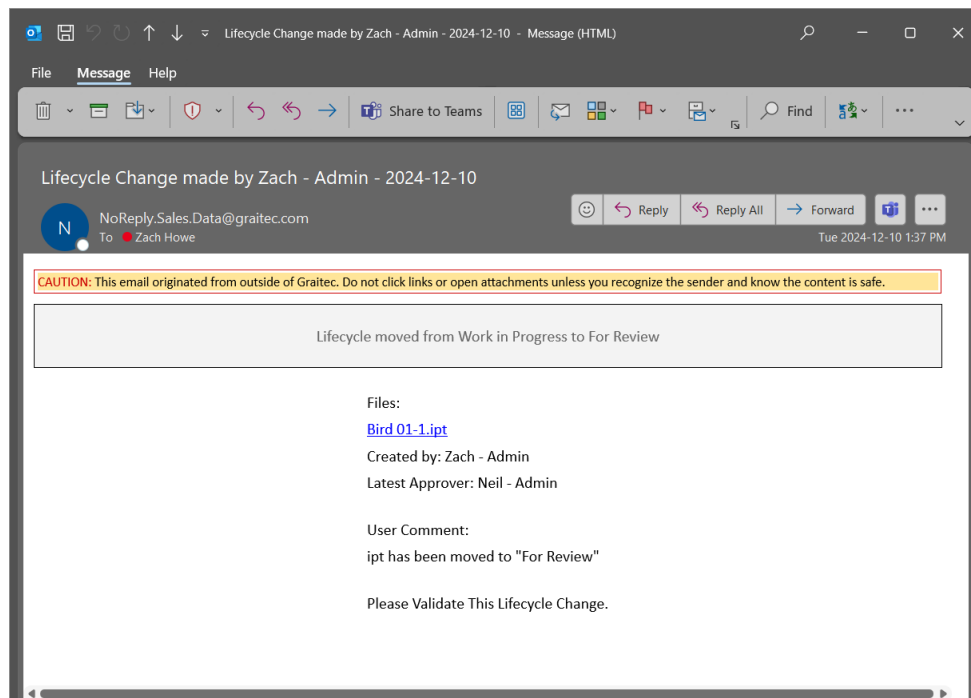

2.2. CC RECIPIENTS

In version 2025.2 of the PowerPack for Vault, we introduced the ability to add CC recipients alongside the standard recipient.

This option will allow the Vault administrator to configure the notification for several people that just need to be up to date about changed information in the Vault.

The CC options have been introduced in the Email Tab but also as a manual option for the end user.

These will allow you to:

1. choose to send an email or not, automatically or manually select the user.
2. select a CC user that will receive the email or manually select it when Lifecycle is changing.
3. select a group to which the email will be sent.
4. include a property.
5. add to CC the user that has made the transition.

Some of the options will be activated based on the selection made for the CC email.

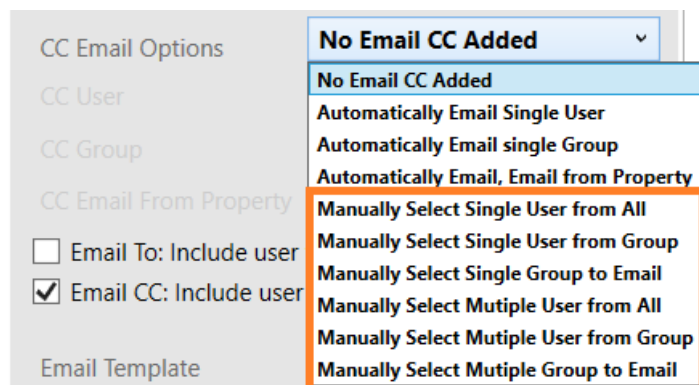

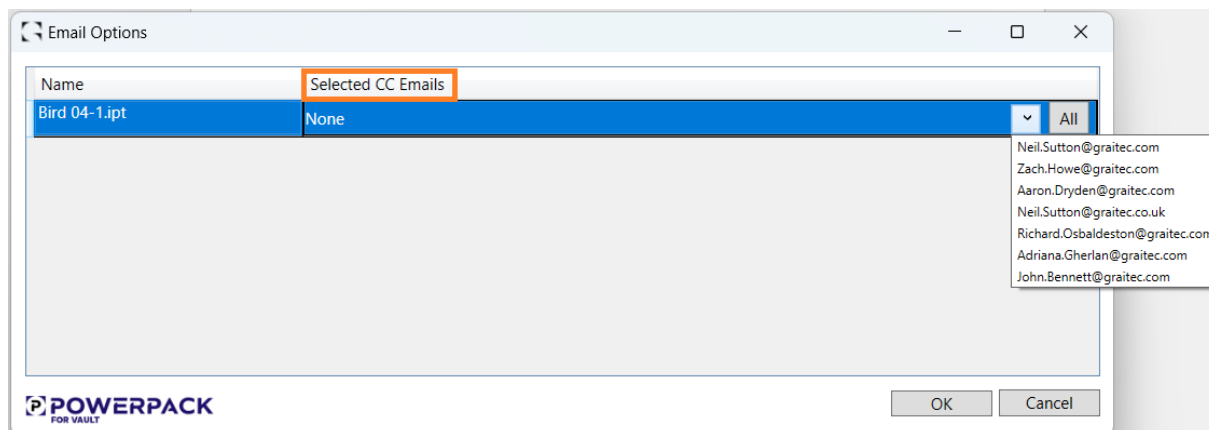
Auto Email, Email from Property

For all manually options, most of the drop-down menus will be deactivated, the end user will be able to select a user or multiple users, or a group or someone from a group, based on the configuration selected in the configuration of the email.



CC manually email options

The following window will pop up when a manual option is selected in the configuration. The email list will be populated with users or groups, depending on the configuration of the Email property tool.

For the case when the email is configured to manually Select Single User from Group, the CC Group will be enables and the admin will have to select the group from which the user will be selected.

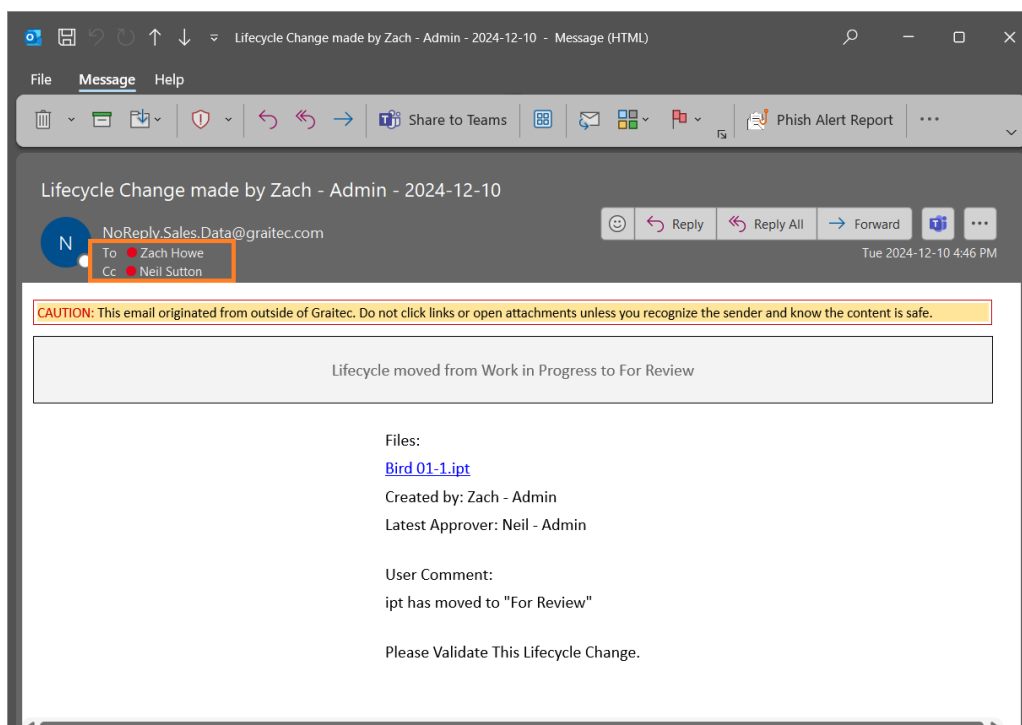
